Swimming Lessons

Swimming lessons provide our students with opportunities to practice physical, psychological, and social skills and acquire new skills in the processes. Individual Education Plans

Thank you to all the parents who have met with teachers to look at the Individual Education Plans (IEP) that have been meticulously created by the classroom teachers. This leads into teachers teaching the skills and concepts and then applying their task analysis testing programs to ensure the students achieve the desired outcomes. Finally, teachers write reports based on the results of the assessments. It was very encouraging to see all parents attend the IEP meeting to catch up and discuss their child's goals for Semester 1. Teachers are busy teaching to these goals and developing assessments to measure your child's progress.

School Buses

We have many students who access the School Bus Service which is operated by the Public Transport Authority. Parents/carers are reminded to please inform your bus driver if their child is absent, has an appointment or are not catching the bus on any particular day. Please also inform the school of any changes to avoid confusion.

Attendance

Term 1 is always a good time to be reminded of the importance of school attendance for children's progress in learning, wellbeing, and overall engagement. Attending school every day makes learning easier for your child and helps them to build and maintain friendships with other children. To give students the best chance within their education and beyond, we work in partnership with families to encourage and support regular attendance at school. It is very important to notify the school if your child will be absent and to provide a reason for this absence.

Secondary Assistance Scheme and Abstudy Years 7 to 12

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) is to assist low-income families with secondary schooling costs for students in Years 7 to 12.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme is intended to provide assistance to secondary students in meeting the costs of books and uniforms and includes eligible home-educated students. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Family Health Care Card, a Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or school.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s registered for study in the secondary years. Application forms are available from Avonvale Education Support Centre offices. Applications must be received by the Schools on or before 27th March 2024.

Dear Room 1 Families,

Here we are in Term 1, and it is well and truly underway with many great things occurring. Our Primary Campus began swimming lessons last Monday. It is a busy and exciting time for the students, especially those who are commencing swimming lessons for the very first time. During these sessions, students also practice many life skills, such as sun safety and wearing sunscreen, they work towards learning to change their clothes and put on their swimming bathers and school swim rashie. Students are also learning about road safety when in a vehicle by sitting in the school bus with their seatbelts on. Everywhere we go, we continue to learn and practise our school values of: Good Listening, Good Work, and Good Attitude.





IEP meetings are also underway, thank you to those families who have had their meetings so far and look forward to those still to come. It is a great opportunity for us to discuss your child's learning goals and areas of focus for them to work towards at school. As students work on their individual learning goals, they also participate in whole class activities. As a class, we are continuing to learn our letter sounds and correct letter and number formations. Our handwriting lessons begin with finger and hand warm-ups, and we are practicing writing on and in between the blue lines. In Mathematics, students have shown great enthusiasm for our new hands-on maths program which encourages them to build their understanding around all aspects of number and in particular the maths games that come with the program.





We would also like to welcome our new students in Room 1. They have settled in nicely with their own little area to work in as well as making great use of our sensory room. As the weather cools down, we have big plans to do more outside dramatic play sessions and more play-based activities. Arts and crafts are a favourite amongst the students, linking well known story books and nursery rhymes with fun, creative artworks. During the hot/extreme weather we had, our class was set up with construction areas on the mat including Duplo Lego, magnets, farm animals and cars and trains. Thank you to families for keeping us up to date with information about your child in ways that may affect them whilst they are at school. We look forward to a great term ahead.
