Dear families,

We are well and truly halfway through the year and students in Room 3 have had a great year learning school routines as well as learning through play.

Our play themes change every few weeks and they integrate English, Maths, Science, The Arts, Health and Physical Education. Some themes we have explored are Transport, The Garden, Dinosaurs, Fairy Tales and The Jungle. We have also celebrated NAIDOC Week, Science Week and Book Week.

In our learning activities, the students experience painting, drawing, collage, playdough creation, construction, talking and listening to others, listening to stories, dancing and making music, imaginative play, and outside exploration. As students have become more familiar with school staff, the routines and each other, speaking and listening skills have increased and current focus is on taking turns, using manners such as "please" and "thank you", asking to use something that another person is using, and asking for help.



Students had so many smiles on their faces when playing in the 'flower shop', where they took turns to be the shop keeper and be in charge of the cash register and serve the customers!



Earlier this term we took advantage of the beautiful sunny days to take our learning outside where students practiced their skills in sharing and turn taking, storytelling, playing with the equipment and talking about what they built (which includes the use of the school iPad communication application to press buttons to help communicate their ideas). Well done!
