A Message From the Principal

Dear parents, carers and community members



Term 1 is 10 weeks long, filled with learning and various activities that will keep us engaged and focused. The first few weeks of Term 1 are dedicated to assessing students and developing programs, including Individual Education Plans (IEPs) and other essential support plans such as meal plans, behaviour plans, risk plans, toileting plans, and medical emergency plans. Following these assessments, teachers will meet with parents to discuss student progress and outline future goals and pathways. The finalised IEPs and other relevant plans will be shared with parents in Week 6. Additionally, with two weeks of swimming and a public holiday, we will all be working efficiently to ensure everything is in place to support student learning and achievement.

To stay updated on what is happening, please take note of the following communication methods between home and school:

- 1. Communication Books These are sent home daily, so please check them for school updates or specific information regarding your child. If teachers have had a particularly busy day, they may only circle relevant information and sign the book, but they will do their best to keep you informed about your child's day. Communication books are checked daily by teachers.
- 2. Newsletters These will be sent home on Wednesdays of Weeks 2, 6 and 10. The final newsletter for the term will be sent home on Wednesday of Week 10, the last day for students is Friday 11 April.
- 3. Term Planner Important dates for the term are included in the planner, so please keep it somewhere visible at home. Any updates will be included in newsletters or sent home in a letter.
- 4. Connect Newsletters and relevant notes are uploaded to the school's Connect page throughout the term. If you have trouble accessing Connect, please let us know, and we will assist you.
- 5. Teacher Communication If you need to speak with your child's teacher, please call the school and make an appointment through Michelle. Robyn or Kylie at the front desk. Teachers will return calls before or after school. When booking an appointment, please let the office staff know the reason for the meeting so the teacher can be prepared.
- IEP Meetings In Week 6, all class teachers will be holding parent-teacher IEP meetings. Each teacher will provide details about their meetings and will contact parents individually to arrange a suitable time. We kindly ask that you respond promptly to the meeting request. These meetings are an essential part of our partnership in supporting your child's education, and we appreciate your commitment to attending. If you are unable to make the suggested times, please communicate with your child's teacher to arrange an alternative. We value collaboration between home and school and look forward to working together to support your child's learning journey.
- 7. Parent Handbook If you would like to receive an updated Parent Handbook, please contact the school, and we will send one home.
- 8. **Email Communication** You can reach the school via email at avonvale.esc@education.wa.edu.au.

Please review the information carefully, make any necessary changes, or tick the box indicating no changes are needed before returning the form. The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) is to assist low-income families with secondary schooling costs for students in Years 7 to 12.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme is intended to provide assistance to secondary students in meeting the costs of books and uniforms and includes eligible home-educated students. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Family Health Care Card, a Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$300 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or school.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.



School Community Health Nurse



A note from the Community Health Nurse

Welcome to the new school year. My name is Georgia Falconer, and I am the Community Health Nurse who visits your school.

Community Health Nurses work in schools to promote healthy development and wellbeing, so students can reach their full potential.

A major part of our work is focused on the School Entry Health Assessment and implementing the School Based Immunisation Program.

We cover a large area across the Avon and Central Wheatbelt, so you will not see us in the schools every day, however we can also be contacted by phone.



The school should be aware of any medical conditions, allergies, medication needs or changes in your child's health status. Your current address and telephone details are essential, so the school can care for your child appropriately and contact you should the need arise. If your child requires medication or treatment, including an EpiPen, you must notify the school/classroom teacher, so that a health care or action plan can be put in place. This should be updated annually and signed by your doctor.

The beginning of each term is a good opportunity to ensure that your child's school emergency medication (asthma reliever or EpiPen) has **not expired**.

Kindy Screening

All children in Western Australia are offered a School Entry Health Assessment (SEHA) during their first year of primary school. We can also offer the SEHA to pre-primary and year 1 students who have not been assessed previously.

The SEHA includes a vision, hearing, height/weight, dental and general health check. Referral to the appropriate health service can be arranged if there any concerns. If you receive a health assessment form, please sign giving your consent and return to school ASAP.

Targeted Screening

Any concerns about your child's vision, hearing, speech, movement, behaviour, development, growth or weight can be investigated, with referral to the appropriate health service if required. Please discuss these concerns with your child's teacher or myself.

Immunisation

Current immunisation status is a requirement for school entry. If your child has not had their immunisations, please make an appointment with your GP or Child Health Service. Any child that is not fully immunised can be excluded from school for a period of up to 2 weeks during a disease outbreak. To get an updated AIR IMMUNISATION History statement either log into Medicare via (my.gov.au) or ring 1800653809.

Health Promotion

I can provide the school community with information relating to Health, including growth and development, healthy eating, physical activity, weight management, hand washing, asthma, anaphylaxis, parenting resources or on any subject requested by the school.
